### **Project Description**

"Communities Working Together" will support 1,500 participants who have multiple and complex needs, to overcome the barriers they face in entering the labour market or in taking up meaningful training opportunities. The project will test innovative place-based approaches focused on Cornwall's most deprived neighbourhoods as identified by the Index of Multiple Deprivation. We will develop eight local partnerships, each made up of voluntary, community, public and private sector organisations. Each partnership will co-ordinate the local delivery of integrated programmes of support for individuals and families based on a strong understanding of the local social and economic environment. The project recognises that for many this will be a long and challenging journey and participants will need significant support, including one-to-one mentoring. Each local partnership will also work to develop the resilience of the deprived neighbourhoods, strengthening their ability to support members of their community.

### **Project Description**

Who Dares Works brings together a partnership of Cornwall based social enterprises and organisations to help people in West Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly who need the most support to connect or reconnect with employment, education or training. The partnership builds on the unique strengths of each organisation working collaboratively to help participants to help themselves - wherever possible through helping others. The partnership prides itself on its collaborative working which includes 1-2-1 mentoring, specialist support, work related activity, work ready clubs and community clubs. At the heart of the project is the Active Plus course. Delivered by military veterans from Active Plus, the course has been designed to build confidence, motivation and self-belief to enable participants to move forward. Alongside attending the course, participants will work with their mentor to determine their long-term goal(s) and achieve them by tapping in to a range of specialist support and a host of workrelated activities, from volunteering to community projects, taster days to work experience and everything in between. For participants moving on from the project, the support doesn't have to stop there. In-work support is offered to help individuals with their transition into employment.

All of the above focuses on the two broader priority themes of participation in work and skills for the potential workforce.
